



DIG IT! 2008 Indian Pueblo Cultural Center Summer Day Camp Program

During the week of June 9-13, 10-12 year old campers will explore the history, art, and culture of the Pueblos through exciting workshops taught by Pueblo artists, museum educators, and Pueblo elders. Camp hours are 9 AM - 5 PM. This year's theme will focus on Traditional Foodways and Agriculture. Campers will explore how foods are planted and grown in Pueblo communities, learn about the meanings of foods in different cultures, about which foods are nutritious, and enjoy preparing healthy traditional Pueblo foods. Each week-long session takes advantage of the Indian Pueblo Cultural Center's unique resources and investigates topics in agriculture, botanical science, archaeology and history, through a curriculum that involves hands-on activities, including the opportunity to help plant this year's garden. .

Field Trips

Our camp will offer field trips to extend our learning. By signing the registration form, parents are giving their permission for students to participate in these trips. There will be no exceptions, as we do not have sufficient staff to stay with children who cannot attend with the rest of the group.

Food

Campers are expected to bring nonperishable food and drink for lunch and should bring a water bottle every day. Campers will be eating lunch on the outside patio, or in their classroom. Healthy snacks are provided as part of the camp experience. Any food allergies or dietary limitations must be clearly identified on the Health Information form to avoid problems when snacks are provided.

Summer Weather

All campers should be prepared for changing weather, wear comfortable clothes and shoes, and should wear sunscreen and insect repellent to protect themselves during outdoor activities.

Arrivals and Departures

Each child will receive a name tag that identifies him/her as an IPCC student. Sign-in will be at Pueblo House. Children may be dropped off at IPCC no sooner than 8:45 for morning programs. Children will be picked up at the same location as morning drop off. Please be prompt in picking up your children. Children must be picked up no later than 5:10 for afternoon program. Have a photo ID with you for identification purposes. If there is a person other than yourself picking up your child, we will need to have that name on file; please inform all drivers that they must have identification with them. **DO NOT TAKE YOUR CHILD OFF THE INDIAN PUEBLO CULTURAL CENTER SITE WITHOUT SIGNING YOUR CHILD OUT AND INFORMING THE CAMP STAFF.**

REFUND POLICY

Cancellations must be received five (5) working days prior to the scheduled camp date. A refund for the total amount minus a 15% administration fee will be issued. Cancellations received fewer than five (5) working days prior to the program will not be refunded. Full fee will be refunded if IPCC cancels a program.

AUTHORIZATION FOR MEDICAL TREATMENT

The Indian Pueblo Cultural Center wishes to avoid difficulties in obtaining medical services for children who may become ill or injured during IPCC activities. As the parent/guardian of a child participating in an IPCC sponsored activity, it is necessary that you consent, in advance, to hospitalization, medical attention or surgery for your child in case an emergency occurs. If no consent is given, you must provide a written statement of procedures to be followed if your child is injured or becomes ill during the activity.

In the event of illness or injury, a reasonable effort will be made to contact you to obtain consent in advance of medical services being given. If we are unable to contact you, Indian Pueblo Cultural Center staff will consent to such services for your child by acting in your behalf based on written advance authorization. That authorization is the consent form below.

I, the parent/guardian of _____ have read the above and hereby designate Indian Pueblo Cultural Center staff to act in my behalf in the event of a medical emergency. He/she may authorize such hospitalization, medical attention, or surgery as may be required in an emergency because of illness or injuries sustained by my child while participating in IPCC sponsored activities. I hereby assume financial responsibility for hospitalization, medical attention, and surgery provided.
